

IMPACT

PROACTIVE GRANT GIVING

The Superior Health Foundation recognizes that there are unmet healthcare needs across the Upper Peninsula that require special attention and additional funding to address issues at a larger scale. Our Proactive Grant Giving process exists to focus on these needs. In 2021-2022, SHF and its funding partners committed more than \$1.5 million in funding to address food insecurity to help ensure access to healthy food for all Upper Peninsula residents through a variety of innovative programs and projects.

FOOD INSECURITY PROACTIVE GRANTS

Feeding America West Michigan's mission is to gather and distribute food, relieve hunger and increase food security in West Michigan and the U.P. Through its Mobile Food Pantry program, it has delivered nutritious food to communities facing food insecurity since 1998. "A Recipe for Success" will empower food-insecure families to become nutritionally self-sufficient by facilitating nutrition/education programming at food distributions. It will provide a library of recipes and online cooking demonstrations to pantries and their guests, and produce 21 live cooking demonstrations.

Partridge Creek Farm, headquartered in Ishpeming, works with the Lions of Michigan District 10-U.P. to assess food insecurity, related health issues and resources; identify "community champions" to create local food insecurity workgroups; and develop, disseminate and exchange information and resources in all 15 counties of the U.P. Grant funding supports creating an educational videoseries, identifying community champions, conducting needs assessments, building farm-school programs, creating training programs and building an Intergenerational Farm Community Space.

UPCAP provides the development, coordination, and provision of human services in all 15 counties of the U.P. Its Food As Medicine (FAM) program's primary goal is to address and improve food security for residents who have or are at risk of developing chronic health conditions. FAM impacts residents with increased access to locally grown fresh produce and knowledge/skill enhancement through nutrition education.

The Upper Peninsula Veterans Community Action Team (UPVCAT) is a collaborative of more than 200 Veteran Service Providers and Volunteers from across the region and state of Michigan. This program will increase access to food by providing grocery store gift cards, health program info and referrals to increase food access.

EQUIPMENT FUND GRANT

Project Jade was awarded a \$2,470 Equipment Fund grant for supplies for special education and speech programs. Project Jade is dedicated to helping special education and speech programs all over the Upper Peninsula with communication tools and equipment. The goal for this project was to provide needed equipment and tools to multiple schools in our area for special needs classrooms. This specifically related to sensory equipment and tools. Project Jade provided five different schools/programs with tools and equipment, including software Phonology programs, classroom tools, actual sensory equipment, and tools for fidgeting and comfort.



EQUIPMENT FUND GRANT

Lake Superior Life Care & Hospice received an Equipment Fund grant for the purchase of fall prevention durable medical equipment. The organization was able to purchase friction reducing devices, bed alarms, tab alarms, monitors, gait belts, fall mats, head gear protectors, elbow protectors, slipper socks, foot protectors, and raised toilet sears with handles. This equipment had a significant impact on patients and families.

ANNUAL GALA

The 11th Annual Superior Health Foundation Gala was held on Saturday, October 1, 2022.

Our partner at the 2022 Gala was the District 10 Lions Club to support its Childhood Cancer Program. We partner with at least one health centered non-profit each year to raise awareness and monies to help provide valuable resources for organizations to carry out projects or provide services they otherwise would not be able to. There are no pediatric cancer facilities in the Upper Peninsula, so patients often travel long distances to receive treatment. The Childhood Cancer Initiative provides money for travel, food, medical and other needed services to U.P. families with children battling cancer. The Lions also support Camp Quality Upper Peninsula, a camp for pediatric patients and their families at Bay Cliff Health Camp, and Kids Kicking Cancer, a non-profit that empowers children to manage pain and stress through martial arts and meditation. The need to support projects and programs like this really tugs at our heartstrings, and we know from our generous business and individual donors, that it tugs at your heartstrings as well! This program was awarded \$16,300.00 at the Gala. The event raised \$113,326.62 in funding to support health centered non-profit work across the Upper Peninsula.

We are deeply grateful for the incredible generosity that makes such a positive impact on the lives of our neighbors and friends.

PAINTING THE PENINSULA PINK

Painting the Peninsula **PINK** is a fundraiser held each year in October to raise money and awareness about the U.P.-wide Breast Health Fund. This funding is available for men and women who are residents of the Upper Peninsula of Michigan who may be struggling to pay out-of-pocket breast health expenses not otherwise covered by insurance/or for the uninsured.

The most incredible experience we have is when we partner with a school in the U.P. This year, our partner was the North Dickinson Nordics girls' volleyball team. The Nordics hosted the Crystal Falls-Forest Park Trojans. It is always uplifting to see young people share their excitement about community resources available to assist others! The students wear PINK and share their own stories about how family and friends have been affected by cancer. There is a community celebration of hope to lift each other up and feel the collective compassion for wanting to care for each other. Money is raised through raffles of beautiful gifts provided by businesses, families and individuals. The laughter and tears shared resonate across the community in the weeks and months after the event.

In 2022, \$19,584.20 was raised for the breast health fund, and a check in the amount of \$1,500.00 was presented to North Dickinson County School to help support its health-centered needs. ANNUAL GOLF OUTING




